Taking Your Career Higher

There is still time to apply for a place on the Certificate in Higher Education Open (CHEO), the new fully-funded HNC-level qualification being offered by Scottish Union

Learning. The two-year part-time course in Business Management will see workers from across the Highlands and Islands come together for the first higher education full qualification offered by Scottish Union Learning in partnership with The Open University in Scotland. To be considered for a place on the course, you should live or work in the Highlands and Islands, be able to demonstrate your commitment and capability to undertake the two-year programme and have no formal qualifications beyond SCQF Level 6 (Scottish Higher). If you earn £22,000 per year or less, you will be expected to apply for the Part Time Fee Grant to maximise the funding available for the CHEO course. (Scottish Union Learning will cover all fees where applicants are not eligible for the Part Time Fee Grant). What subject areas are included in the certificate?

Students on the Certificate of Higher Education Open course will complete four modules at SCQF Level 7 over two years.

Module 1: Oct 12 - March 13: An Introduction to Business Studies explores the common aims and characteristics of business – investigating what makes them different. (30 credits)

Module 2: Apr 13 - Sept 13: Managing in The Workplace shows how management ideas and activities are built into your existing knowledge and skills. (30 credits)

Module 3: Oct 13 - March 14: Working and Learning: Developing Effective Performance at Work is an introduction to the skills of work-based learning. (30 credits)

Module 4: Apr 14 - Sep 14: Professional Communication Skills for Business Studies explores how to succeed in business studies, and business in general, through effective communication. (30 credits)

CHEO Key Dates

The important dates and activities in the run-up to the new CHEO course include:

From 23rd July: Applicants to complete Part Time Fee Grant applications (for registration day on 27th August) 3rd August: Closing date for **CHEO** applications w/c 6th August: Candidates advised if their application is being taken forward w/c 13th August: Candidates interviewed by telephone to establish suitability 27th August: Enrolment of successful applicants and induction activities 28th August: Induction and orientation 6th October: The first CHEO module begins
