## **New Year, New Opportunities!**

The start of 2013 will see the roll-out of the Ready, Study Go initiative, which aims to build confidence and study skills in individuals who would benefit from some support to take the first steps towards formal learning. The course is being delivered by a network of Union Learning Reps across the Highlands and Islands, who have been trained as Ready Study Go tutors as part of a pilot project for Scottish Union Learning, supported by the European Social Fund.

Details of the course, which include topics such as learning styles, career planning, formal writing and managing time, are being distributed to ULRs, along with posters, to help publicise the scheme.
