2013 H&I Development Fund bids' success

The current Highlands and Islands Development Fund projects have been successful in their bids to continue their work, bringing lifelong learning to workplaces across the region.

Dan Henderson of the RMT and Catherine Deveney of the NUJ were among those to have their bids supported, following the recent announcement by the Scottish Government to provide continued funding for Scottish Union Learning in 2013-14.

Both the UNISON Development Fund Project and the Migrant Worker Project, hosted by UNISON, will continue to run in the Highlands and Islands. Marta Chaba, the Migrant Worker Project Worker, and Philippa Clark, the UNISON Development Fund Project Worker, will work closely on providing learning opportunities to migrant workers, women and low paid workers in remote areas of the Highlands and Islands. The common ground between the two projects has helped them develop a more integrated approach in reaching out to workers in new workplaces which has been particularly successful in relation to work they are doing in small care homes.

Dan's project, helping maritime workers on CalMac ferries to access learning, will aim to increase the scope of courses on offer and consolidate the learning partnership with Caledonian MacBrayne, which saw the company recognised with an award at the recent Highlands and Islands Scottish Union Learning Awards. Catherine's project aims to bring vital traditional and digital skills to workers in the media, as well as working with key partners across the Highlands and Islands to create a learning infrastructure which supports the future of the industry.
