Workshop Round 1

WORKSHOP 1a: Monkey Business!

Scottish Union Learning

Feedback from the 2012 Highlands & Islands ULR Conference showed that ULRs were interested in finding out more about how they could access and use SurveyMonkey, the online survey tool. This workshop will provide a practical demonstration on how ULRs can access (free of charge) and use SurveyMonkey for online surveys, such as learning needs assessments, and other purposes, eg recruiting for courses and allocating course places.

Would you like to make more use of your photos to promote union learning in your workplace, union and wider press? Workshop Round 2

WORKSHOP 2a: The Future is Now Lorcan Mullen, UNISON Area Organiser

Only 13% of workers between 16 and 24 are in a union and this age group makes up only 5% of all union members. Union learning statistics for the Highlands & Islands show that only 7% of total workers supported are been between the ages of 16 and 24. Supporting and organising young people must be a priority for unions. Young workers are not just the future of our movement, they should be active members now. With a specific focus on the Highlands & Islands, this workshop will seek to identify practical steps unions can take to support young trade union activists and organise young workers in the region.

WORKSHOP 2b: Using Individual Learning Accounts (ILAs) to Fund Courses. Eleanor Adam, Scottish Union Learning

In the last few years there have been a number of changes to ILAs. This workshop will provide up-to-date information about ILAs, covering subjects such as the type of courses funded by ILAs and who is eligible for ILA funding. The workshop will also provide information about the Part-Time Fee Grant (previously known as the ILA £500), who can access it and what it is for.
